

Call for Papers

eSocial Sciences and Humanities (eSSH)

A new online scholarly journal

Invites submissions/contributions for its first issue to be published in November 2017.

eSSH will publish work in all the fields of inquiry within the Social Sciences and Humanities, provided the work is submitted in English. Keeping the readership in mind, essays need to be theoretically rigorous but written in as accessible and readable manner as possible, without unnecessary jargon and acronymized prose. Essays running to 3000-5000 words are preferred, Work-in-progress, or essays written exclusively for *eSSH* are welcome. The journal will, in addition to the regular essays, include a section 'Reports', for short write-ups on seminars, workshops and conferences, and an 'Announcements' section for book news, CFPs, conference notices, fellowships and other opportunities.

Submissions may be only in MS Word. Author's name and affiliation should be on a separate page and no details of the author should be on any of the pages of the submission. The text should adhere to the eSS stylesheet. Visual materials are to be supplied at 600 dpi, properly captioned and located precisely within the essay. Permissions to be sought for reprinting visual material will be the sole responsibility of the author/s.

All essays will be subject to blind peer review processes. Essays may be sent back for revisions based on the reviewer's comments.

eSSH will be a part of eSocialSciences and will feature on www.esocialsciences.org It will however also have an independent website, very soon, integrating a journal management system so that submissions may be made directly from the website. In the interim until the website is launched, submissions will need to be sent to essheditors@gmail.com. The processes of registering the journal with the Registrar of Newspapers and for acquiring an ISSN number have been set in motion.
